

Bumped Head – Parent/Carer Information



- Parents will receive a phone call from school informing them that their child has bumped their head.
- A follow-up text message providing a link to the NHS advice page regarding head bumps will be sent.
- A 'Bumped Head' wristband will be given to a child who has bumped their head and been seen by a school First Aider.
- A bumped head also includes bumped eyes, nose, mouth or any part of the head or face.



- The 'Bumped Head' wristband makes it visible to all school staff that a head bump has occurred.
- The wristband will remain on the child's wrist until they go home at the end of the school day/after school club.
- The wristband indicates that a First Aider attended to your child and notifies you of the date and time of the incident.
- It will be explained to the child that the wristband must stay on their wrist until they get home.
- In rare circumstances, symptoms can develop up to 24 hours after the injury, should this occur, please refer the child to a doctor or A&E Department.
